Matthew 6:26 says, "Look at the birds of the air: they neither sow nor reap nor gather into barns, and yet your heavenly Father feeds them. Are you not of more value than they?"

Sprinkled throughout all of these seasons we had many seniors that signed scholarships with various colleges and universities both near and far to continue their athletic and academic careers. This year included a lot of travel and fun games.
